
Income Inequality - CMSM Kawartha Lakes

The best way to understand this graph is to think of the population in Kawartha Lakes or Haliburton County to be made up of 100 people. The 10 people with the highest after tax income receive 23.2% and 24.2% of the total income received in Kawartha Lakes and Haliburton County respectively. Meanwhile, the 10 people with the lowest after tax income receive only 2.6% and 2.4% of the total income received.

It is important to note that the data includes the entire population, adults and children. The equivilized Census Family after tax income was applied to each person in Kawartha Lakes and Haliburton County. This means that the total family income is divided by the square root of the total family size. That value is then applied to each individual in that household.
